

Instructions for preparing a presentation

There are two ways in which you can prepare your presentation:

- (a) PowerPoint Slides OR
- (b) PowerPoint Posters

Both should follow the content guidelines below. Presentations should be in *English*.

To create a PowerPoint poster, follow the steps:

- 1. Visit http://www.makesigns.com/SciPosters Templates.aspx
- 2. Select a PowerPoint poster **template** (use 36"x48" template size).
- 3. Modify as needed and insert your project information to showcase your proposed content.

Content to include (but not limited to)

PowerPoint Slides should contain the following information in each slide. PowerPoint Posters should contain the following sections on the poster.

- Title of project/paper.
- Background/Summary of literature review.
- **Methods** (if research project) Clearly stated research question/area of inquiry; Clear description of methods used to address question/area.
- **Findings/Conclusions** This may reflect findings or conclusions from a research study or other relevant information.
- **Discussion** Relevance of topic to child welfare (children, youth, and families) practice, policy, research and/or education.
- Conclusion Implications for Social Work practice, policy, research and education.

*Evaluation criteria for selection to participate

Proposals will be reviewed for

- Quality/clarity of writing
- Quality of literature review
- Originality
- Relevance to the field of children, youth, and families
